

I. RESOLUTION: The Southeast Section of The Ninety Nines, Inc., hereby adopts the following at the Southeast Section Meeting held at CHATTANOOGA, TENNESSEE ON APRIL 23, 1994.

II. NAME: The name of this Scholarship program shall be the Bonnie And Archie Gann Memorial Scholarship

III. PURPOSE:

A. To assist the recipient (female or male) in attaining the necessary ratings to work full time or part time in an aviation career with the qualification that this scholarship should not become a means for obtaining ratings only for self gratification.

B. To perpetuate the Memory of Bonnie and Archie Gann

1. History of Bonnie and Archie Gann:

Bonnie started flying in 1973 while her husband Laird was stationed in Key West. She had seen the fun and challenge he was having with his lessons. She became the 1st woman to receive her with her husband and 3 children moved to Merritt Island, Florida.

Her enthusiasm for flying lead her to become a staunch supporter of aviation and especially women pilots. She built up her hours and ratings by flying as a "go-fer" for an aviation dealer at the local airport in Merritt Island. She held ASMELS, Commercial, Instrument, CFI, CFII, AGI and was currently working on her ATP. She soon joined the 99s where through the years she held all the offices on the Chapter level then proceeded on to the Section level where the highest she could go was Governor. She then became very active with the International Board and spent much time in helping rewrite the bylaws.

At the time of her death she had been elected to the International Board of Directors. She found time daily out of her busy schedule of being wife, mother, Assistant to her Dr. husband, and flight instructor to phone or write people about some current or future ideas she had to better promote the 99's and aviation.

She gave speeches, seminars, and did time study observations at airports. At the drop of a hat she willingly gave time and energy to bring awareness of general aviation to the public. In 1974, she became interested in air racing. From that year on and until her untimely death she participated in more than 30 races and except for a very few, she always finished in the top 5 or 10 places. She was much sought after as co-pilot due to her innate ability to know where they were at any moment. She was never reluctant to share her knowledge with other contestants.

She and her husband owner several planes through the years. A 172, 210, 180, Mooney, Cherokee 6, and two Beech Barons. However, she was "at home" in anything she flew, from either left to right seat. Anyone who had even the shortest ride with her soon found themselves at the controls getting an abbreviated lesson. She even had a supply of student pilot log books which she would fill in and sign and present to her passenger.

During the early 1980's she and her husband divorced. To get through that difficult period she worked full time teaching Instrument ground school and giving levels of flying lessons. Ironically, in on of her classes a man who was to become her future husband, Archie Gann. Archie said Bonnie was the only woman he ever knew who could answer all his technical questions and tell him what to do.

She was active in many other organizations besides the 99s i.e.: Florida Race Pilots Assoc., AOPA, Florida Grasshoppers, Baron Owners, and Chief Judge for NIFA for several years and coordinated their regional competition and the Brevard Aviation Association. She and Archie helped found the B.A.A. and she served as President of it for 2 years. Her full time jobs were president of Orange Computer and Floridata Services and bringing influence and harmony into the lives of their 7 children.

She was much respected by men and women in all walks of life. To emulate her would be an honor, a privilege and a worthwhile goal.

Archie was introduced to aviation in the early 1980's by his friend and business partner, Dennis Jaffee. While working together trying to raise catfish in above ground swimming pools, Dennis introduced Archie to his favorite hobby, flying. Although the catfish farm crashed and burned, Archie's love for aviation only kindled a flame that very quickly led to a private pilot certificate and a joint purchase of two 152's and a 172 with Dennis Jaffee. Up until late 1983, Archie and Dennis leased these three planes out of Orlando West airport and eventually bought a Cessna 210 which became Archie's set of "wings".

While taking an instrument ground course at Brevard Community College, Archie met Bonnie Quenzler, his instructor. Their mutual love of aviation helped foster a relationship that had Bonnie instructing Archie in his quest for his Commercial certificate with Multiengine and Instrument ratings. This relationship also led to their marriage on Feb. 15, 1985. From that moment on, the two of them were an unbeatable team as far as flying was concerned. Archie, also, was always there to help in furthering interest in aviation. He helped with races, meetings, and any organizational duties needed. His fine mind and sense of humor endeared him to all who knew him and especially those he worked so closely with in the aviation field.

It was meant for them to go together for either one would have been lost without the other.

IV. ELIGIBILITY:

A. Refer to the Southeast Section Scholarship Guidelines For "The Bonnie And Archie Gann Memorial Scholarship."

Within the United States, it is necessary to have formal scholarship applications backed up by rules and requirements because the sections of the Ninety-Nines, Inc. are under IRS scrutiny because of the 501(c)(3) Income Tax exemption and there is a prohibition against the use of the section funds for individuals, because the section's and chapter's funds are considered "public" money of a charitable organization. Therefore, Sections with

individual scholarship programs must be very careful to assure that their program is one which is made available to a wide range of applicants. .

The requirements are as follow:

Applications will be accepted as follows: Both female and male pilots in the Southeast Section.

Section rules should state how the scholarship is to be advertised, and make sure that it gets a fairly wide exposure.

Specify what publications the scholarship will be advertised in, and where flyers or brochures or other information will be distributed.

The applications should require complete information about an applicant's background, and future plans as far as use of the scholarship is concerned.

A photograph or snapshot of each applicant is required.

Since a scholarship is for a certificated pilot, copies of current certificate, medical and BFR should be required.

The application should ask for information about any violations or accidents, and whether a medical has ever been refused or lost for any reason.

Where the applicant may have been flying professionally, information should be sought as to whether or not the applicant has ever been terminated from a flying job and why.

There will be a committee to evaluate the scholarship applications. This committee will be from our Southeast Section.

Money should be paid directly to a flight school or flight instructor, not to the applicant(s) themselves. Substantiation of charges for funds paid must be given to the Section. That could be such things as a bill from the school or instructor, and copies of the student's logbook showing instruction given and signed off.

A time deadline should be put on the use of funds. The length of time allotted may depend on the amount of the qualifications of the school as part of the application.

A disclaimer should appear on the application blank that the applicant signs as follows:

"Neither the Southeast Section of the Ninety-Nines, Inc., The Ninety-Nines, Inc., nor their members, agents, or representatives, are responsible for the quality of any training received with this scholarship, nor for any accident, incident, or any other event which may occur while the recipient of this scholarship is performing flight training or activities relating thereto, and recipient agrees to sign a hold harmless

agreement in favor of said entities upon receipt of the scholarship and before any flight is made."

Such an agreement is enclosed.

Also on the application blank, either before or after the disclaimer, there should be a paragraph reading,

"I declare under penalty of perjury that the information I have given is true and correct and that I meet the requirements for this school."

Then have a signature and date line.

You are advised to submit your proposed scholarship guidelines for review before finalizing them.

V. FUNDS: The existing scholarship fund shall be a perpetual fund replenished by:

A. SOURCE:

1. The proceeds of an annual fund raiser, planned, promoted, and overseen by the current governor and the three (3) trustees.
2. Funds received as individual donations, generated by individual chapters, advertising through a) our Southeast Flightline and b) Touch-N- Go Florida.

B. Administration: The funds shall be administered by the Board of Trustees acting by a majority vote of a quorum at meetings called and noticed according to bylaws adopted by the Trustees, as they shall from time to time be amended. Through such action the Trustees shall collect, invest, and distribute all such funds.

C. Investment: The trustees shall appoint an investment advisor from the Southeast Section General Membership to hold that office from year to year. The first such advisor shall be Julia "Judy" Corbett Hall. The investment advisor shall:

1. Advise the Trustees of a pattern of investment best able to secure maximum financial gain in secure investments.
2. In the event that the Board of Trustees are unable to act through lack of a majority favoring any course of investment the investment advisor shall vote to make the majority.

VI. TRUSTEES:

A. The Board of Trustees shall consist of four (4) Trustees.

1. Four (4) Trustees shall be selected in the following manner:

A. The current Governor of the Southeast Section of the 99's Inc. shall serve as a member of the board during the time she holds office as Governor. The current Governor and member of the board shall be Nancy Lucile Wright.

B. The immediate past Governor shall serve as a member of the board during such time as she is immediate past Governor. The immediate past governor now serving is Constance "Connie" Wilds.

C. The present governor shall appoint a member of the board from the general membership of the Southeast Section of the 99's Inc. to serve while the current governor continues in office as Governor.

D. The following member of the family of Bonnie and Archie Gann shall designate a member of the family to serve as a board member. The family members shall from time to time jointly designate other family members to the panel which selects the family member.

B. DUTIES OF THE TRUSTEES:

1. To manage and invest the scholarship fund.

2. To distribute information and applications which includes:

Dates, Deadlines, Interviews, and notification when scholarship(s) will be awarded.

3. The Board of Trustees will receive scholarship applications.

4. The Board of Trustees will choose the most deserving applicant(s).

5. The Board of Trustees will make scholarship award(s) to the recipient(s) chosen.

VII. WHEN AWARDED:

A. The scholarship will be awarded annually at a time determined by the Board of Trustees.

VIII. HOW AWARDED:

A. The scholarship will be awarded by a presentation made at a regular meeting of the Section.

IX. TERMINATION OF SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM:

A. In the event that there are no qualified applicants for the scholarship or that the funds available for the scholarship are so depleted that it can no longer accomplish its purpose

the Board of Trustees may vote to terminate the Bonnie and Archie Gann Memorial Scholarship. Any remaining funds will revert to the Southeast Section of the 99's Inc., in compliance with the provisions of that certain letter from the Internal Revenue Service to the Southeast Section, Inc. of the Ninety-Nines, Inc. dated December 13, 1983. A copy of which is attached for ease of reference.

E. Vicki Lynn Sherman has agreed to become a permanent Trustee to replace Shirley Zillig, who is resigning as Head Trustee as of May 31, 2000.

Therefore as of May 31, 2000, the Board of Trustees will be as follows:

- Present Governor
- Past Governor
- Permanent Trustee (Vicki Lynn Sherman)
- 2 members of the Bonnie & Archie Gann family
- Financial Advisor (Judy Hall)

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES BYLAWS

- I. The meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be governed by these Bylaws which may be adopted or amended at any regular meeting of the Board of Trustees by a majority of vote.
- II. The meeting of the Board of Trustees shall be called by the Governor, or in her absence, the past governor, or at the request of any two members of the Board.
- III. Notice of meetings may be given by mail, or facsimile reproduction, at least twenty four (24) hours prior to the meeting, should notice be given by any other method the informality of notice may be waived by the vote of the majority of the Board.
- IV. The regular meetings may be held by telephone conference with one or more members in attendance by telephone.
- V. The regular minutes shall be kept of all meetings, including telephone conferences and copies of the minutes shall be mailed to all Board members to be approved at the next meeting of the Board.
- VI. The Governor shall preside at all meetings, except that in her absence, the Past Governor shall preside.
- VII. The presiding officer shall appoint a secretary to keep the minutes of each meeting. The official minutes together with all copies of all records and papers of the Board of Trustees shall be maintain by the Governor.
- VIII. The Board of Trustees shall meet no less frequently than once each year.
- IX. The quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting shall be the majority of the Board.
- X. All actions of the Board shall take place by a majority of vote.



In attendance: Nancy Wright, Governor, Connie Wilds, Past Governor, Vicki Sherman, Vice Governor, Shirley Zillig, 99 and Family member, Judy Hall, Financial Adviser.

The above 5 persons were designated as Trustees to initiate a memorial Scholarship per the request of the 7 children of Bonnie and Archie Gann. It was decided to provide 2 Scholarship awards per year, 1 for a woman and 1 for a man, to be used to further their education toward attaining CFI/CFII ratings.

The Scholarship money was funded by memorial donations from friends, family, business associates, flying organizations and fund raisers. Under the watchful eye of the Financial Adviser, steps will be taken to maintain adequate funds.

Termination of the Scholarship Program: In the event that there are no qualified applicants for the scholarship or that the funds available for the scholarship are so depleted that it can no longer accomplish its purpose, the Board of Trustees may vote to terminate the Bonnie and Archie Gann Memorial Scholarship. Any remaining funds will revert to the Southeast Section of the 99's Inc., in compliance with the provision of that certain letter from the Internal Revenue Service to the Southeast Section, Inc, of the Ninety-Nines, Inc. dated December 13, 1983.

Guidelines were determined regarding; management of funds, application forms, eligibility requirements, disclaimers and the awards to be announced annually at the S.E. Section spring meeting.

The above intentions were submitted to International Headquarters in Oklahoma City for approval, to conform with the 501 (c)(3) Internal Tax exemption.

Upon obtaining approval from Headquarters, in 1994, the first scholarships will be awarded at the Spring S.E Section meeting in St.Petersburg, Fl. May 20th 1995.
