AMELIA EARHART LUNCHEON - Saturday, Jan. 22, 2011, YWCA, Birmingham, AL. This event is co-sponsored by the Alabama 99s and the Birmingham Zonta Club with all proceeds going to the Amelia Earhart Birthplace Museum. Our speaker will be Julie Williams, author of Wings of Opportunity: The Wright Brothers in Montgomery, Alabama. 2010 marked the 100th anniversary of the establishment by the Wright Brothers of the nation's first civilian flight school, located in Montgomery, AL. This significant event in Alabama history is marked by this timely publication. Peering through the lens of contemporary news accounts, Dr. Williams traces the history of the flight school and its reception by a southern community of the early twentieth century looking to move beyond the scars of the Civil War and warily intrigued at the opportunity offered by the Wrights and their modern technology. The press' reporting and sometimes misreporting "reflected the misconceptions, hopes, dreams, and fears about aviation in 1910, painting a picture of a time when flight was untested, unsteady, and unavailable to most people."
