Florida 99s Meet an Astronaut!

Members of the Gold Coast and Paradise Coast Chapters of the 99's, at the invite of the FL Gulfstream Chapter, attended a presentation at FAU in Boca Raton Florida on November 21, 2013. For 45 minutes we listened as Dr. Edgar Mitchell told us the story of "One Path To The Moon", his personal story of his first flight at age 4 on his family farm in Texas, working the flight line at a local airport in high school, flying for the Navy, getting is Doctorate at MIT, and more, all on his incredible journey to the Moon. Partnered with Alan Sheppard in the Apollo 14 Mission Dr. Mitchell is one of only 12 people to ever walk on the moon. Dr. Mitchell shared his personal photos, told us about their duties & training prior to his space travel, as well has his duties and experiences on their moon walks. Completing the presentation he told us his feelings about being in space and walking on the moon. A short Q & A session followed.

SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED: Three lucky ladies have been selected!!! The Florida Goldcoast Chapter of the 99s will present three scholarships to Florida aviatrixes in December. ADF Airways, an FAA approved 141 Flight Academy at Kendall Tamiami Executive airport, will donate a 737-800NG Jet Checkout, (16 hours in the simulator). Using their new state of the art simulator, the 737-800NG program enhances CRM and strengthens cockpit skills necessary to succeed in commercial aviation. ADF is one of Miami's premier flight schools. They are approved by the Department of Veterans Affairs and also have Part 61 training. Assistance is also available for foreign students desiring FAA ratings with their student visas.

The Fran Sargent Scholarship, for \$2000, will be presented to a female Florida aviator to pursue her Multi-Engine rating. This annual scholarship was named in honor of WASP Fran Sargent, a highly respected 99 who taught many Goldcoast members to fly. Fran was instrumental in creating this scholarship by raising funds over the years. She also mentored applicants for this scholarship as well, as for the Amelia Earhart Scholarship.

In 2013, the FL Goldcoast Chapter sadly lost a favorite member, WASP and Congressional Gold Medal recipient Helen Snapp. Helen flew aerial target towing and participated in the first drone development. Helen proudly piloted the B17 Memphis Belle during War Bond promotions. Many of Helen's friends and family generously donated over \$1500 for this one-time memorial scholarship in her honor.

L. Hunley (submarine)



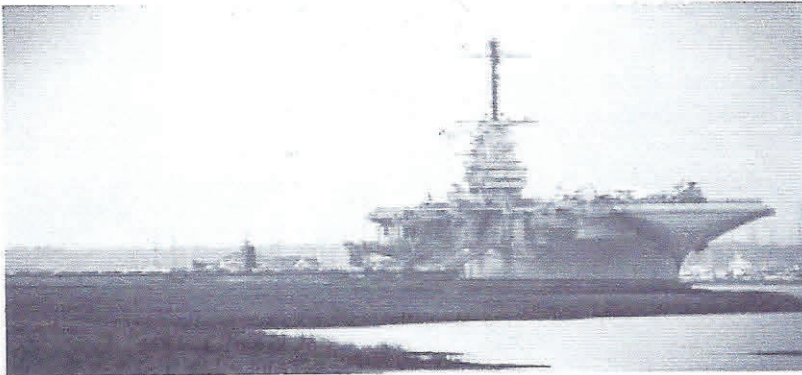

L. Hunley was a submarine of the Confederate States of America that played a small part in the American Civil War, at a large role in the history of naval warfare. The Hunley demonstrated both the advantages and the dangers of undersea warfare. It was the first combat submarine to sink an enemy warship, although the Hunley was not completely submerged and was lost at some point following her successful attack. The Confederacy lost 21 crewmen in three sinkings of the Hunley during her short career. The submarine was named for her inventor, Horace Lawson Hunley

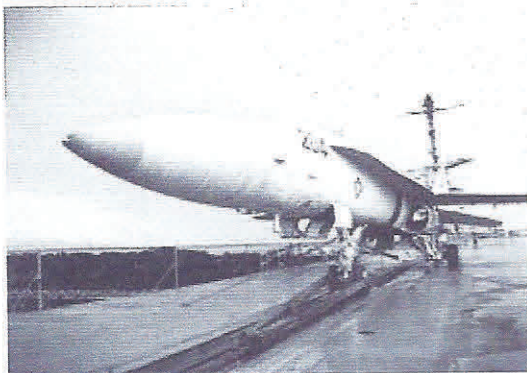

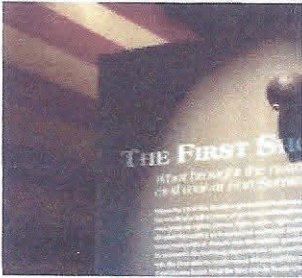

HISTORY OF FORT SUMTER

Fort Sumter means different things to different people. For everyone it represents the beginning of the bloodiest and most divisive conflict in American history that pitted countryman against countryman, and brother against brother. Yet somehow from its ashes the country arose united and stronger because of it. As Ken Burns, director of the award winning PBS series, *The Civil War*, said, "The Civil War was the greatest event in American history, where, paradoxically, in order to become one, we had to tear ourselves in two."

The war that began at Fort Sumter evokes reflection upon the noblest of human ideals such as duty, honor, freedom, sacrifice and valor. Yet it also harkens contemplation of baser aspects of the human condition such as slavery, suffering, political turmoil and death. The birthplace of the Civil War will always be a focal point in the American psyche because it did so much to expose and define us. Different people may draw different meanings from the conflict and what gave it birth, but its birthplace – Fort Sumter – will always be venerated.

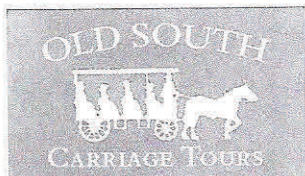

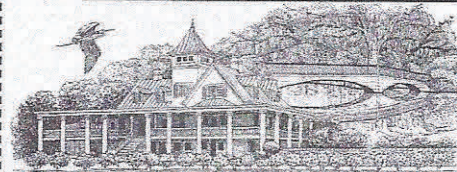
