2023 Spring Meeting Minutes

Southeast Section of the 99s

April 29, 2023

St Augustine, FL

Janice Pelletti Southeast Section (SES) Governor called the meeting to order at 9:01 am.

The chapter roll call was made by Janice McWilliams SES Secretary. There were eleven chapters in attendance and a quorum was declared.

Lois Horne, Vice Governor introduced the SES board members in attendance: Janice Pelletti, Governor; Lois Horne, Vice Governor; Janice McWilliams, Secretary; Ramona Banks, Immediate Past Governor; Anita Mixon, Director. Lois thanked all the members of the SES board for their service. Lois introduced our 99s International Board Representative Nivedita Bhasin, 99s International Director. Lois then acknowledged all of the SES past governors in attendance; Ramona Banks, Mae Marquet, and Corbi Bulluck. Lois also recognized Nivedita Bhasin as a former Governor of the India Section.

Janice Pelletti asked if there were any additions or corrections to the minutes from the Fall SES Business Meeting as presented in the Spring Section Meeting Packet. Several corrections were noted; Terri Bazacos' name was misspelled, the name Kathy Quinlan needs to be changed to Kathy Howitt and Carol Voss has a list of other misspellings that she will give to the secretary. Mary Bryant made a motion that the minutes be accepted as amended per the changes requested. Anita Mixon seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Janice Pelletti thanked Jessica Mendez and all of the Firstcoast 99s for their work in hosting the Spring Section.

Janice Pelletti acknowledged the first-time attendees to a SES section meeting.

Kay Kline and Heather Alexander of the Florida Firstcoast Chapter handed out prizes: farthest traveled went to Nivedita Bhasin who traveled from India, the prizes for 99s who flew to Section in their own planes went to Mae Marquet and Nina Marousek, most recent check ride went to Christine Bell. The prize for 99 in attendance who had been a continuous 99 member for the longest went to Janice McWilliams (Laurie Reeves was the longest continuous 99 member in attendance but recused herself as she is a member of the host chapter).

Officers Reports

- Lois Horne, Vice Governor reported that Janice Pelletti met all the goals she set for her tenure as Governor; fill the committees, rework the bylaws, grow the SES membership. Janice also helped revitalized the Blue Ridge Chapter. Lois's Vice Governor complete report is in the Spring Section Meeting Packet.
- Janice McWilliams, Secretary gave her report as printed in the Spring Section Meeting Packet.
- Caroline Hodges, Treasurer joined the meeting via speaker phone for the treasurer's report. Caroline reported the SES received income from the International Conference in the amount of \$6865 which helped increase our income. The SES New Horizons Scholarship was increased to \$3500. The SES expenses remained fairly flat. Caroline noted that our recurring donations have dropped off. The complete financial report and 2023-2024, budget can be found in the Spring Section Meeting Packet
- Anita Mixon, Director gave her report as printed in the Spring Section Meeting Packet.
- Ramona Banks, Immediate Past Governor reported that she will be working the Air Race Classic (ARC) stop at Pell City, Alabama and is looking for volunteers. The Fall section will be in Huntsville, Alabama and she will report more on that later. Her complete report is printed in the Spring Section Meeting Packet
- Janice Pelletti, Governor reported on attending the Blue Ridge Chapter Girl Scout Day. Janice was pleased to report that several out-going 99s press releases have been published in a variety of aviation publications. The Governor's complete report is in the Spring Section Meeting Packet.

International Representative's Report

Lois Horne introduced Nivedita Bhasin, 99s International Director.

Nivedita expressed her gratitude for the warm welcome she has received. Nivedita encouraged everyone to be sure and vote in the international elections by May 1 and to elect to vote electronically. The election results will be available the end of May.

- October 27-November 2 is the International Conference in Jordan
- May 10 at 8pm will be the Nancy Wright webinar on travels to Jordan
- The 99s will have a booth at Oshkosh, please consider volunteering if you plan to attend Oshkosh.
- August 25 & 26 will be the 99s International Board of Directors Meeting in Oklahoma City.
- International has three important points to share;
 - 1. International is working to cut cost, we can help by opting to receive the 99 News Magazine virtually.
 - 2. Please consider honoring someone; a family member, friend, CFI, by purchasing them a Friend of the 99s membership.
 - 3. 99s membership has topped 7000. International Board of Directors has set a goal of 10,000 members by 2029.
- The 99s International Board of Directors has begun a search for a Development Manager. The position is currently being advertised.
- Professional Pilots Leadership Initiative (PPLI) is a great opportunity for anyone interested in a professional career in aviation
- July 8 will be the induction of the newly elected international officers

Financials

Financial Report; Carolyn Hodges, Treasurer. Janice Pelletti began the report in Carolyn Hodges absence. Janice reported that all the new budget recommendations made at the Fall SES Business Meeting are reflected in the budget presented in the Spring Section Meeting Packet. The SES board agreed on the budget at the SES board meeting yesterday Friday April 28.

Committee Reports

- Ways and Means; Ramona Banks, the complete report is in the Spring Section Meeting Packet. Ramona encouraged everyone to consider a recurring donation to the SES.
- Jewelry Sales; Kelli O'Donnell reported for Kim Elsholz. Kim has the jewelry for sale with her here at Spring Section. Check with Kim if you are interested in purchasing jewelry. The jewelry sales will be turned over to Ramona Banks at the end of the Spring Section meeting.
- 501c3; Jeanne Burklund. Jeanne was not present, Janice Pelletti stated that Jeanne has reported to her that all IRS reports have been filed.

Financial Report continued; Carolyn Hodges treasurer joined us online. Carolyn reported the 2023-2024 budget is in the Spring Section Meeting Packet and the April reports are now on the shared drive. The SES has income of \$5.00 per member with approximately 1000 members. Other income is from recurring donations and proceeds from the International Conference. Most of the SES expenses remained fairly flat with expenses for web advertising, bank fees and section meetings up slightly. Donations for the Amelia Earhart Birthplace and the Museum of Women Pilots were increased to \$500. The SES did not donate to NIFA this year. Our donation to the Forrest of Friendship remains at \$100. In our New Horizon Scholarship Fund the scholarship was increased to \$3500 and a second scholarship added.

Janice Pelletti asked if there were any questions concerning the 2023-2024 proposed budget. Corbi Bulluck asked about the expense item of \$600 per year for QuickBooks. Carolyn Hodges has done everything on QuickBooks and believes it would make the transfer of the books to the incoming treasurer easier. Corbi then asked if the SES Board has looked into getting QuickBooks at a discount through platforms such as Tech Soup. The discussion continued concerning getting a discount for QuickBooks and how Tech Soup works. Janice Pelletti suggested we leave the budget as is with an expense item of \$600 for QuickBooks and the SES board could look into possible discounts.

Corbi Bullock made a motion to make a one-time increase to the SES donation to the Museum of Women Pilots (MWP) to \$1000.00. Corbi noted that our bank account is healthy and she is aware of the need for extra funds for MWP. The discussion continued concerning the need for funds for the MWP. Mae Marquet seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Vicki Greenleaf asked about the funds listed in the budget for the WASP Luncheon. It was noted that the luncheon is now the Trailblazers Luncheon. Corbi Bullock believes the luncheon is an international item and not a SES item. It was noted that Myra Bugbee former chair of the Trailblazers Luncheon and Anita Mixon current chair of the luncheon had discussed the Trailblazers Luncheon being a SES event with 99s International President Robin Hadfield. The SES Board discussed the luncheon at a previous board meeting

and the SES board selected to keep the luncheon as a SES item. It was also mentioned that donations for the luncheon come from sections and chapters outside of the SES. Corbi believes the matter needs to be presented to the 99s International Board. It was decided that Nivedita Bhasin report back to the 99s International Board concerning the issue of whether the Trailblazers Luncheon needs to be an International Item or a SES item.

Carol Voss made a motion that we accept the 2023-2024 budget as printed in the Spring Section Meeting Packet with the change of the luncheon name from WASP to Trailblazers and the donation to MWP increased to \$1000.00. Lois Horne seconded the motion and the motion passed.

- Education; Ruth Jacobs. Ruth was not present, her report is in the Spring Section Meeting Packet
- Membership; Mary Woody. Mary reported we are the second largest section. Mary acknowledged two members who have most recently received their pilot certificates, Amanda Barker and Ivy Adams. Mary also acknowledged several of our longstanding members; Marcia Gitelman Spacecoast Chapter 55 years, Margaret Ragaz Carolinas Chapter and Eleanore Reichenbach FL Goldcoast Chapter 60 years and Carol Baney Georgia Flying Belles 70 years. The complete report is in the Spring Section Meeting Packet
- NIFA; Marilyn Shafer. Marilyn reported there have been changes in NIFA, they no longer provide gender specific awards. In the past the SES donated to NIFA's women's achievement award, since that is no longer available Marilyn is planning to start a 99s Women Collegiate Award to support college women pilots. The 99s still support NIFA events. The complete NIFA report is in the Spring Section Meeting Packet.
- Website; Ramona Banks. Ramona asked everyone to please make sure their chapter information is updated on the SES website. The complete report is in the Spring Section Meeting Packet
- New Horizons; Lois Horne. Lois reported nine applications have been received. The New Horizons Scholarship board is reviewing the applications and a winner should be announced by June 2. The complete report is in the Spring Section Meeting Packet.
- Fly Now, Myra Bugbee. Myra was not present her report is in the Spring Section Meeting Packet

Janice Pelletti announced Lois Horne was awarded an Amelia Earhart (AE) Scholarship for her multi -engine commercial rating. Mae Marquet announced Annemarie McMillan was awarded the AE scholarship for academics.

Maria Choi gave a presentation on the 99s PPLI program. The program is a leadership and mentoring program open to all 99s interested in becoming a commercial level pilot. The program is an 18-month commitment. Those interested can find applications on the 99s website. Application deadlines for the two programs offered each year are January 31 and July 31.



Air Marking report

Where do you see the Ninety-Nine Logo in your communities?

- Flyer at your local airport
- Maybe on an article of clothing worn by a member
- The I am a Pilot Button
- Where else?

Branding is a way of defining a business to our members, and external audiences (aviation community, fellow aviators, and on social media).



Good brand identity will attract new members, supporters of the Ninety-Nines and new aviators to our local communities. So, if you are relying on your members to wear 99 articles of clothing or a flyer to draw new members for brand recognition then growth will be slow. Companies today use billboards or large advertisements in newspapers and internet sites. We as aviators have the best canvas, the airport tarmac, or hangar roof to place our brand for all to see, while at the airport or from the air. Did you know Air Marking started as a means of navigation in the 1930's. The Ninety-Nine brand has been around for 90+ years.

Now is a good time to check in with your local airports to see if there is a need to REFRESH or RENEW (much like make-up on our faces in the morning) markings on the airport (tetrahedron, landing markers, airport names or symbols or a compass rose). In these cases, the Ninety-Nines supply the WOMAN POWER to get

the job done and the airport authority supplies the paint. Memphis has been able to lay down a compass rose complete with 2 coats of paint in an 8-hour period. Want to know how we are efficient at getting it done quickly. We have refined our processes and are willing to share our insights. So, round up your girlfriends, 491/2's, Friends of the Ninety-Nines and your local aviation community members to assist in making our brand more recognizable. Girl Scouts and boy scouts like to get community service activities too. Don't forget to ask your local newspaper to come out and promote the event. Carry on the tradition of air marking by the Ninety-Nines and add the NINETY-NINE BILLBOARD to your local skies. When Ninety-Nines travel around, I know they like to post aerial shots of compass roses on social media another great marketing tool in brand recognition.

HELPFUL HINTS: The airport's county highway department may have expired paint that you can use for the compass rose activities, since typically using highway white and handicap blue to paint compass roses. Memphis chapter pours straight from 5-gallon buckets to the surface to eliminate paint waste and the number of supplies needed (don't need paint trays). Just need a few folks with paint rollers and sticks to spread the paint out before it dries.



Let's Go Fly a Kite!

Did you know that one of the most famous kite flyers of all time was a 10 year-old boy? His name was Homan Walsh, and with out him the Niagara Falls Bridge would not have been built in 1847. Before building of the bridge could begin, someone needed to get a line from one side of the gorge to the other. Homan successfully flew a kite from one side of the gorge to the other, and his kite line was the first to span the gorge. After securing Homan's initial kite string, heavier and heavier line was fed across until a steel cable could be connected across the gorge so that bridge construction could begin. Homan Walsh was rewarded with a ten-dollar cash prize, which was a lot of money in 1847!

Another famous kite flying duo were the Wright brothers, Orville and Wilbur Wright. Before building the first successful airplanes, they experimented with various designs by using kites. By making many different kite models of their airplanes, they eventually came up with a design that worked, and the rest is history. There are many different kite designs. Some kite designs are very old, like traditional Chinese and Japanese kites. Some designs are very new, like the dynamic stunt kites used in sport kite flying competitions. These kites are made with modern materials and designs which make them ultra maneuverable. Kites come in all shapes and sizes, as you can see in Figure 1.



Figure 1. This image shows several different kinds of kites.

How does a kite fly, allowing Homan and the Wright brothers to accomplish their feats? As someone runs with a kite, the wind going head-on into the kite creates a **force** that pushes up on the kite. This force is called **lift**. This lift force goes perpendicular to the wind and it pushes the kite up into the air. At the same time, another force pulls the kite back. This force is called **drag** and is

caused by the wind catching on the kite itself, pushing the kite back in the direction that the wind is going (see Figure 2). Altogether, these forces cause the kite to go back and up when you fly it.

Here is where interested passengers or pilots will fill out their information. Just click and follow the directions. It is important that our chapters begin to use the online registration program. The online registration program is how The 99s will collect data to verify the value of our *Let's Fly Now!* First Flight Program as it impacts our membership numbers. In the future, I hope to find ways to recognize those highflyers.

Membership Committee

As of January 1, 2023 the Southeast Section of the Ninety-Nines has welcomed 78 new members, and 140 since our last SES meeting in October 2022. The Southeast Section now has 1,097 of the organization's 7,104 total Members. Of that 1,097 total, 1,048 are *Current* members, 30 are listed as on *Standby*, and 19 are on *Hold*. As a reminder, *Standby* means that the member is one month past due on their membership fees, and *Hold* means that they are two months past. SES accounts for roughly 15.4% of the international total of Ninety-Nines membership. This ranks us second largest out of the eight US National Sections, behind the Southwest Section. Looking back over the past couple of years, in 2021 we had a total of 209 new members and in 2022 we welcomed 291.

For this year so far, the four Chapters with the highest recruitment success since January of this year are the Nashville Chapter, which has welcomed 11 new members, the Georgia Flying Belles Chapter with 10, and the Carolinas 9 new members. Here is a chart showing recruitment by chapter, looking at both the 2023 numbers and the new members since our last section meeting.

Activities Accomplished:

- We still plan to gather every month, with every other month a virtual business meeting and the opposite month an in-person activity. Over the holiday months this winter we did make some changes to that schedule, however.
 - November: We organized a Control Tower tour of KTRI Tri-Cities Airport in Sullivan County, TN and opened it up to any female pilots in the area. Though we didn't enjoy any guests outside of our own membership and our 49.5s, we did enjoy a large turnout of our members.
 - o November. A few days later we did meet virtually for our business meeting
 - January & February: We had another productive planning business meeting in January, but due to scheduling and availability we did not meet in February. To help remain in contact with our members, we continue to use the online marketing platform MailChimp to send out newsletters. We've experienced an average open rate of 70%.
 - March: We've continued to forge a mutually beneficial partnership with a local community college, Northeast State, who has an Aviation Technology Department

and training facility on the grounds of KTRI Tri-Cities Airport. As part of Girls In Aviation week, we helped them to organize an educational outreach day. This was a very successful and well-attended event, bringing field trips from neighboring cities, home-schooled families, and other local girls interested in aviation. Five of our members were on hand to represent The Ninety-Nines.

Mentoring Opportunities

• We're grateful to our member Brenda Robinette who continues to mentor and encourage two of our student pilot members, Megan Armstrong and Candace Lamb. Megan is excelling in the Southwest Airline Destination 225 program, and Candace continues with her student pilot training. Also, at the Girls In Aviation Day event we encouraged each girl to connect with other women in aviation to help them on their own journey, and offered The Ninety-Nines as an example of mentorship opportunities available to them.

Education

 Our two educational activities were very well received and attended. The tower tour in November was a great opportunity for our members to meet their local ATC and better understand the equipment and processes utilized. At our March educational outreach event with Northeast State Community College, we taught the Girls In Aviation Day visitor about the phonetic alphabet, VFR vs IFR flights and their aeronautical charts, and each of our five members present spoke about their own journeys and/or careers in aviation.

Scholarships Presented

• The Appalachian Aviatrixes will present three scholarship opportunities, one for student pilots, a second for advanced ratings, and a third to go towards check ride fees. Our scholarship committee has been reformed for 2023 and details of the scholarship will be made available online on our website and the Southeast Section website.

Community Outreach

• March: At our Girls In Aviation Day we had plans for a Let's Fly Now opportunity, which were unfortunately canceled due to the weather. With our partnership at the college, we anticipate other opportunities to be made available in the future, though.

Upcoming Events

- We are in discussion with NSCC to paint a compass rose outside of their technology facility.
- *April*: We will represent The Ninety-Nines during the NSCC's Girl Scout Day by providing some aviation-related learning activities. These are very young girls, so we'll focus on engaging activities like aircraft marshaller signals, ATC light gun signals, and discuss the variety of ways they can get involved in aviation.
